AN ARTIST IN OUR MIDST



Robert Toshio Otoshi is the featured artist at the MOA Wellness Center gallery this month. Bob and his wife, Sandra, are Keola La'i residents. Bob is a life-long artist of amazing skill and a master of *sumi-e*, the Japanese art of brush stroke painting.

Interestingly enough, the same tools are used for centuries-ink. stone and brushes. When the brush is wet, the tip is like the point of a needle, enabling the artist to make broad strokes as well as those like silken threads. Sumi-e requires disciplined strokes—there is no room for error. Bob said that at times, he's done the same sketch 50-60 times to achieve the right result, other times it may take with first stroke. shape the Experience teaches precision.

The masterworks are available for viewing through February at the MOA Wellness Center gallery Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
